SCIENCE

Activity 1. Friction Detectives: Slip or Grip?

Objective: Identify how friction affects our daily activities by testing how easy or hard it is to grip objects using different materials.

Materials Needed (easy to find at home):

- A smooth spoon or glass
 - A plastic bag (or wear a plastic glove)
 - A rubber band or piece of rough cloth
- (you can use different things)

Instructions:

1. Take the spoon or glass in your dry hand and try to pick it up. Was it easy or hard? Now try it with wet hand.
2. Now cover your hand with a plastic bag or gloves and try again. Did it slip?
3. Next, wrap your hand with a rubber band or rough cloth and try again. Was it easier?
4. Record your results like this:

Step 2: Write Your Reel Script

Keep it short and simple — about 4–5 lines (15–30 seconds reel).

Example:

- “He helps me do my homework...”

- “...and even reminds me to take a break!”
- “Thanks to AI, learning is more fun!”

Step 3: Create Visuals Using AI Tools

Ask an adult to help you use any of these free tools to create cartoon-style images or characters:

Tool Name	What It Does
Bing Image Creator / Craiyon	Type prompts like: "Cartoon robot helping a child"
Canva (Free App/Web)	Create reels by adding images, text, animations
CapCut or InShot	Edit short animated videos with music or voiceover

Step 4: Make Your AI Reel

Put everything together:

- Use your AI images or animations
- Add your script (as text or voice)
- Add music or fun effects (optional)
- Keep it between 15 to 30 seconds
- Show it in class after the holidays
