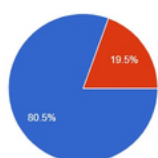


Summer Camp Survey Insights

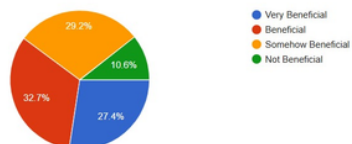
1. Were you aware of the purpose of these summer classes?

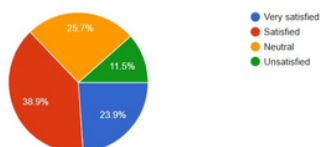
2. How beneficial were the summer classes for completing your syllabus?

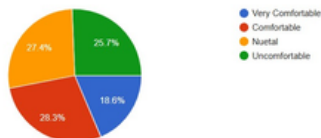
3. Were you satisfied with the school atmosphere?

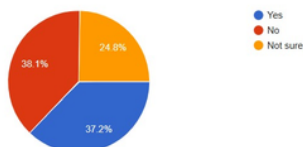
4. How comfortable was the timing of the classes (7:00 AM - 10:00 AM)?

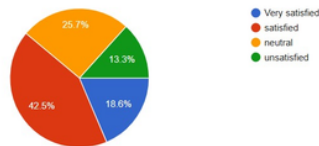
5. Do you think summer classes should continue in future years for syllabus completion?
